What is Title I?


Bethune Middle is identified as a Title I school as part of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). Title I is designed to support State and local school reform efforts tied to challenging state academic standards in reinforce and enhance efforts to improve teaching and learning for students. Title I programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support family engagement. All Title I schools must jointly develop with all parents a written parent and family engagement plan.



School Plan for Shared Student Achievement

What is it?

In support of strengthening academic achievement, Bethune Middle School receives Title I, Part A funds and therefore must jointly develop with, agree on with, and distribute to parents and family members of participating children a written and family engagement policy that contains information required by section 1116(b) and (c) of the Every Students Succeeds Act (ESSA). The policy establishes the school's expectations for parent and family engagement and describes how the school will implement a number of specific parent and family engagement activities, and it is incorporated into the school's plan submitted to the local educational agency (LEA).



How is it revised?

Bethune Middle School invited all parents to attend our Title I Input Meeting, Revision Meeting, and our Title I Informational Meeting, to review and revise this parent and family engagement plan, as well as the school wide plan, our school-parent compact and the family engagement budget. Additionally, a survey was sent home to all parents for them to provide specific feedback to the school, and parent input and comments regarding this plan are welcome during the school year through an online form. The plan is posted on our school Web site for parents to view and submit feedback throughout the year. All parent feedback received during the year will be used to revise the plan for the next school year. We also distribute an annual survey online, by email, and sent home with students to ask parents for their suggestions on the plan and the use of funds for parental involvement. Parents can also give feedback during several parent meetings and activities during the school year.

Who is it for?

All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families, are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. Bethune Middle will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents with limited English, parents with disabilities, parents of migratory children, and parents of homeless students, as required under Section 1111 of the ESSA in an understandable and uniform format, including alternative formats upon request, and to the extent practicable, in a language parents understand.

Where is it available?

At the beginning of the year, the plan is distributed to parents at our Title I Annual Meeting and a copy is sent home with each student in their first report card. The plan will also be posted on the school Web site. Parents can also retrieve a copy of the plan in the Parent Resource Center.

2017–18 District Goals

- To move 10% of the students performing at the Beginning, Developing, and Proficient levels on the Math GMAS to the next performance level or higher.


2017–18 School Goals

- To move 10% of the students performing at the Beginning, Developing, and Proficient levels on the Math GMAS to the next performance level or higher.
- To move by 10% the percentage of students scoring at Beginning, Developing and Proficient when the compared to the scores from the Science 2017 GMAS in the 5th and 8th grades.
- Decrease by 2% the number of student discipline referrals and students missing 6 or more days, and increase parent/teacher contacts.
- 100% of core content teachers (ELA, Math, Science, Social Studies) will use appropriate, current, instructional technology.

School-Parent Compacts



Bethune Middle believes that parent and family engagement means the participation of parents in regular two-way, and meaningful communication involving student academic learning and other school activities, including ensuring:


- That parents play an integral role in assisting their child's learning.

Bethune Middle is Branching Out!

Bethune Middle will take the following measures to promote and support parents and family members as an important foundation of the school in order to strengthen the school and reach our school goals. We will:
